their own.

To make it more clear, we can consider the announcement of bringing digital currency of the government. This announcement is very vague and at the same time practical. Because 70% of the country's population resides in villages and the literacy rate of the country is also only 78%, in such a situation, the government is not clear about the expansion of digital currency. Along with this, in this context, even if we talk about only urban areas, at present, India is struggling badly with online fraud. The government system is not strong enough to get rid of it. In such a situation, when even normal online banking transactions are not completely secure, the introduction of digital currency itself seems to be a rush and an attempt to divert public attention.

Similarly, if we consider the field of education, the government has announced that it will open a virtual university, as well as the E—Vidya scheme will also be expanded. But the biggest question here is that in a country like India, where ten crore families are living without TV and mobile, are suffering from extreme poverty, how will the technology be transferred to them. The government's emphasis on online education somewhere shows indifference and sensitivity towards the future of the poor.

In one sentence, instead of creating trust, the government creates fear for the future of the country.
